Celebrating the Renovation Homestretch



Auraria Library's \$32.8 million, five phase renovation began in 2011 and celebrated the start of the final homestretch in October with

a **Rededication Ceremony.** Renovation stakeholders gathered outside the new Lawrence Way entrance for remarks and a ribbon cutting under the new cayenne canopy followed by a casual catered lunch in the newly renovated community zone and cafe space. Guests enjoyed a cake inspired by the Lawrence Way entrance

and explored new and renovated spaces by taking self-guided tours. The following week, the Library hosted a two-day **Homestretch Celebration** in the Library for students featuring Lawrence Way canopy inspired bookmark and earbud giveaways. Students took self-guided tours and entered a drawing for

gift cards by sharing their favorite things about Auraria Library. The new spaces overwhelm ingly topped the list of favorites.

Fostering Faculty Partnerships


The Education and Outreach Services department is continuing their partnership with CU Denver English Comp II faculty to incorporate information literacy instruction sessions into the Comp II curriculum. In the fall, students in Comp II participated in librarian-lead instruction sessions that emphasized evaluating articles and identifying the Library's "Start My Research" discovery tool. The information literacy session has been updated for spring courses and will now be adaptable for online and hybrid sections of Comp II.

Responsive Website Launch



The new Library website developed in-house by Auraria Library's Web Services Unit launched over the winter break. Guided by a responsive design approach, the site

strives to deliver the optimal viewing experience. The site allows desktop webpages to be viewed in response to the size of the screen or web browser you are using whether you are on your phone or on a tablet or computer.



Bigger & Brighter King Faculty Room

Auraria Library's King Faculty Room provides a space for faculty who occasionally enjoy escaping their office as well as those who may not have access to a campus office. With funding from the Kenneth King Foundation, the Library created a faculty-only space equipped with PCs, a scanner, a local-areacalls telephone, a counter height laptop table, wireless capability, and a comfortable lounge seating area. The new, larger King Faculty Room (room 130) is located on the first floor of the Library and features windows that look out on to Curtis Street. Faculty may request the King Faculty Room access code at the Ask Us Desk and enjoy a fresh perspective in the new space.





Explore the Works of Goethe



The latest addition to the Auraria Library Digital Collections is Goethe's Works Illustrated by the Best German Artists. The 10-book set features the

works of Johann Wolfgang Von Goethe, one of the most prolific members of the Sturm un Drang literary movement. The engravings were cut by dozens of German artists including Eugen Klimsch, Max Volkhardt, and Otto Seitz. During the month of Feburary, the set of books will be on display in the **Reading Room** in Special Collections.

Collaborative Classrooms

Collaborative Classrooms feature flexible furniture, high definition projectors, and a layout conducive to active learning.



Stairways

The first floor of Auraria Library offers spaces for active collaboration, while the second floor is a haven for quiet study. The three internal stairways are wrapped in acoustical material to prevent the buzz of group work from transferring upstairs to the quiet study area.



Courtyards

The interior courtyards of Auraria Library were landscaped with sustainable native plants. Outlets and wireless internet create a functional and inviting outdoor study space.



Public Art

Public art designed and installed by Lead Artist Andy Dufford and the talented team at Chevo Studios complements the renovation. Coloradoan stones featuring relief carvings of plants native to Colorado transect the Library and "pin" the building in to the landscape.



Creative Technology Commons (CTC)

The CTC provides support at the nexus of media, design, and technology. Students and faculty can learn to work with digital storytelling and multimedia production tools. A small portfolio photography studio featuring a DSLR camera, lighting kit, and various backdrops are available by reservations, where patrons can benefit from expert help in using photography equipment, documenting their work, and editing images. The CTC also features a large format printer and

provides support for research poster and presentation design.




Discovery Wall

The Discovery Wall fosters engaging presentations and creative collaboration, open by reservation to all instructors and student groups on campus. When not in active use for learning, it serves as an impressive showcase of campus activities, student work, and library resources.



Special Collections

Auraria Library Special Collections is home to unique and special materials from manuscripts to audiovisual objects. While many regions and cultures are represented the primary focus is on materials relating to the history of Auraria Campus and the neighborhood preceding it. The collection includes Hispanic American and Asian American experiences in Colorado, and civic change and activism including the Amache Collection. The Reading Room is open to anyone who wishes to make use of Special Collections' holdings.



MakeLab (Opens 02.23.2017)

MakeLab will be the home of 3D printing and scanning at Auraria Library, fostering exploration of the boundary between physical and virtual reality. The space will encourage inquiry into these technologies and support the use of rapid prototyping and 3D digitization tools in the research, teaching, and learning of Auraria campus faculty, staff, and students.



Group Study

Since 2014, Auraria Library has added 12 study rooms and 9 study alcoves, creating a variety of spaces for students to study individually and work on group projects. Students can reserve study rooms ahead of time or use alcoves as needed.




Quiet Study

The goal was to match pictures of Latino authors and their biographies with book covers from their major works in the Library's holdings.
